

Central Community College offering Franklin High School Early College Opportunities

If you are a high school junior or senior and at least 16 years old, you can earn college credit now through CCC's Early College course offerings

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Articulated

High School Articulation is an alignment of selected high school courses to CCC curriculum. Articulated courses give juniors and seniors the opportunity to earn high school and college credit at the same time. These courses are known as dual credit courses.

There is no cost for articulated courses. In order to receive the college credit, the student must earn an A or B in the articulated course.

College credit earned will be recorded on the student's CCC transcript at the end of the school year.

Articulated agreements will remain in place through Spring Semester 2017 unless otherwise noted in parentheses by the high school course name listed below.

Career Pathways

Career Pathway courses allow juniors and seniors the opportunity to take college courses while still in high school. Students who complete the course will earn high school and college credit. These courses are known as dual credit courses.

Students may take a sequence of college courses while in high school which could lead to a CCC certificate upon completion.

CCC tuition applies to Career Pathway courses. Tuition assistance may be available, check with your school counselor.

General Education

General Education courses allow juniors and seniors the opportunity to take college courses while still in high school. Students will earn high school and college credit at the same time. These courses are known as dual credit courses.

CCC tuition applies to General Education courses. Tuition assistance may be available, check with your school counselor.

College classes are taught on-line, televised, lecture, lab, or face to face instruction either in the high school or at our campuses and centers.

Students are required to meet college admission requirements by taking the ACT, ASSET, or COMPASS test. Check with your guidance counselor for current minimum acceptance scores.

Transferability of Early College courses are determined by the receiving institution. Central Community College transcripts can be sent to any college upon the student's request.

Create an Account

Before enrolling in Early College courses, students will first need to complete an online profile. You can do so by going to www.cccneb.edu/Apply. Select 'Create Account' to get started.

Students will need to complete an 'Early College Registration' form before enrolling in any General Education or Career Pathway courses. These applications will be provided by CCC's Extended Learning Services offices or by your school counselor.
