

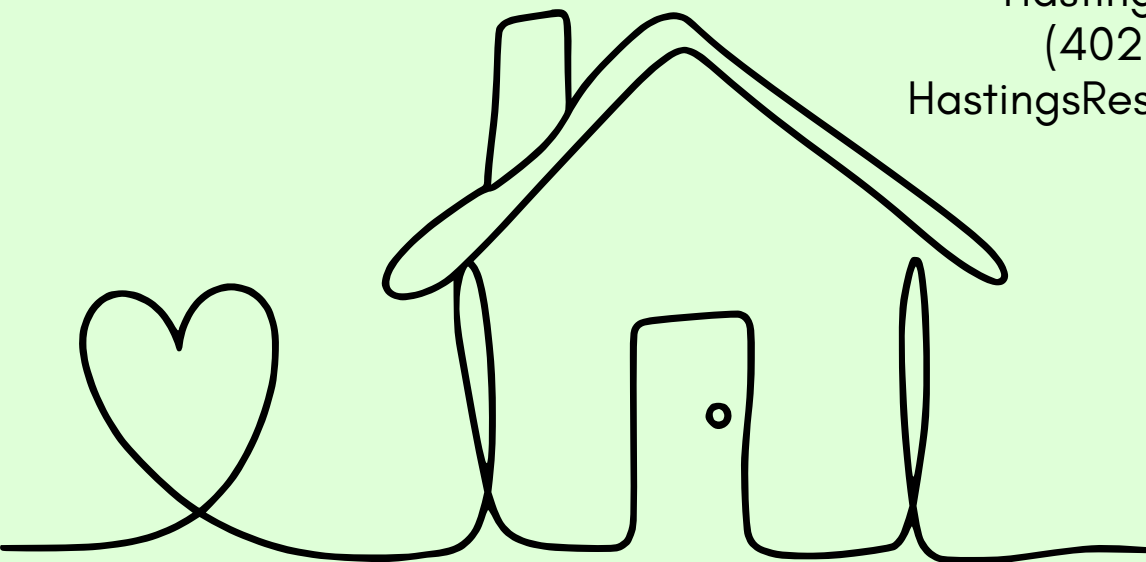

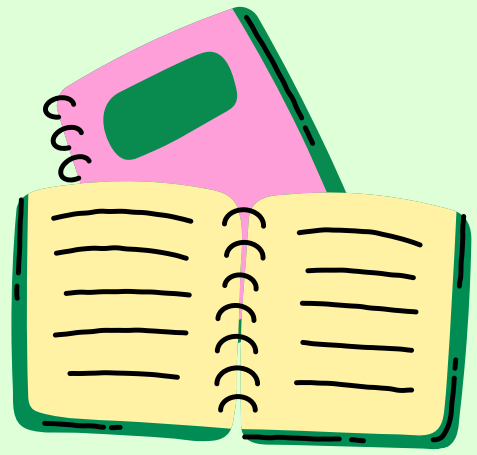
Welcome TO THE RESIDENCE HALL COMMUNITY

ROOMMATE ASSIGNMENTS

The Housing Office assigns each student a roommate. Roommate selection is determined from the information noted on the Housing Application.

Residents who are not satisfied with their roommate or room assignment must speak with residence life staff. Room/roommate changes will be granted after the second week of the semester,
if space is available.

Roommate requests are honored when possible and only if all students have made a mutual request.





MOVE IN DAY!

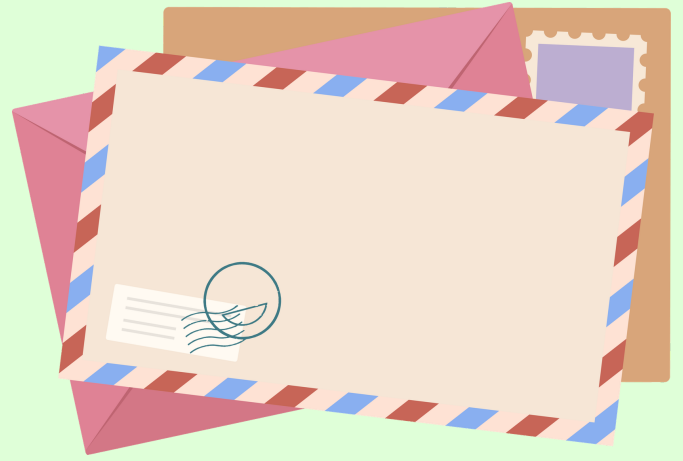


First, head to the Gym in the Dawson Building. This is where you'll check that all your paperwork, housing deposit, and other requirements are complete. You'll find staff from Financial Aid, Student Accounts, and Housing there to help you with anything you still need to take care of. Once you've finished checking in at Dawson, you can go to your assigned Residence Hall. There, you'll get your check-in packet, keycard, and other important info. You'll also meet your RA team—they're excited to welcome you and help you get settled!

Residence Life and Student Engagement host a variety of events throughout the year. Week of Welcome is the perfect opportunity to jump in, meet new friends, and make campus feel like home. From fun activities like Central Kickoff to opportunities to connect with other students and learn about campus resources, there is something for everyone. CENTRAL GALLEY

AKA THE CAFETERIA

Your dining service is managed by Chartwells Dining Service, a nationwide food service firm. Chartwells works closely with the College and you to provide a variety of nutritious menu options combined with personalized service for a pleasant dining experience.

The Central Galley is located in Hall Student Union. You may utilize a meal exchange over at the Commissary if you choose not to eat in the Central Galley. Students may only use their meal exchange 1x per day M-F.

ITEMS NOT ALLOWED IN THE RESIDENCE HALLS

In order to ensure the safety and security of our residents, some items are not allowed in the residence halls. Please **DO NOT** bring any of the following items with you when you move in.

1. Alcohol or drugs **(including signs or paraphernalia)*
2. Tobacco and Nicotine Products **(including signs or paraphernalia)*
3. Weapons and firearms **(including paint-ball guns, orbeez guns, & knives with a blade over 3 inches)*
4. Large stereo speakers and/or sub-woofers
5. Electric Blankets
6. Cooking appliances *(other than microwave)*
7. Space Heaters
8. Bleach
9. Halogen Lamps
10. Candles, incense or other open flames **(wax melts are not allowed)*
11. Plug-in air fresheners
12. Live animals *(unless they are approved ESAs/service animals)*
13. Extension cords of any kind
14. Nails or anything that will do permanent damage to the walls
15. 3D printers, CNC Machines, Laser Cutters, Engravers, etc.
